

Academic High School General Information

Accreditation

All courses taught at Archbishop Mitty High School are University of California and California State University approved courses. The rigorous, college preparatory curriculum offered prepares students for admission to the leading colleges and universities in America.

Age

High School class placement and academic credit is granted to students entering 9th grade or older in high school.

Class Size

Class size averages 27 with a teacher/student ratio of one-to-sixteen.

Daily Schedule

Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 12:00 noon

Break Available from 9:50 am - 10:10 am daily.

Snack food is available for cash purchase in the school cafeteria during break.

Tuition

Course Tuition is \$650 per semester; \$1,300 for 6-weeks.

Registration

Online Registration opens March 1, 2018 at 8:00 a.m. A \$200 Non-Refundable Fee is required to register. Once course enrollment is full on or after March 1, 2018 registration for that class is closed. **No wait list is available.** Parties still interested in enrollment can inquire prior to the first day of class regarding any potential class openings.

Once you have selected a course, you will have a window of 15 minutes to complete the registration. To best utilize your time, please have the following personal information ready:

- Two contact names with phone numbers
- Two contact names with phone numbers that can pick up your student from school

Cancellation Policy

A class may be dropped and a refund issued up to the first day of class, June 12, 2018. The \$200 registration fee is non-refundable. Once the first day of school begins at 8:00 am, no refund of any tuition is permitted regardless of the reason for the student dropping.

Attendance Policy

Each 6-week course is equivalent to a year of college preparatory curriculum instruction worth 10 high school credits, and thus is taught at an accelerated pace. A student who is taking an academic class for credit may only miss one (1) day of class in a 3-week period of time and must take the final exam(s).

Final exams are given on the last day of each session (June 29th and July 20th) and will not be rescheduled to accommodate absences. **Students must take the final exams in order to be eligible for transcript credit.** Students missing more than three (3) days in 6 weeks will be dis-enrolled. No refund of any tuition is permitted once a student is dis-enrolled.

Transcript Policy

Academic transcripts can be requested and sent to either the home or school of the student upon successful completion of a course. The opportunity to request a transcript is available when registering for the course.
